
• Federal Title I funds funnel down to states

Local (LEA)


 Flagler County School District provides funds to eligible Title I schools in the district Title I Programs Provide Supplemental Support to Students, Teachers, and Families!
Some examples of possible supplemental supports are:



- Additional teachers & para-professionals to support small group instruction
- Extra time for instruction (before or after school tutoring opportunities)
- A variety of supplemental teaching materials and supplies
- Technology (hardware and software)
- Reading/Math/Science Coaches and additional training opportunities to provide on-going professional development to school staff
- Parental involvement activities, resources, and communications



What is the Title I "Parents' Right to Know" letter?

Federal law requires that schools notify parents if their child has been taught for four or more consecutive weeks by a teacher who is not highly qualified. Parents may also request information about the professional qualifications of the student's classroom teacher including, at a minimum, the following:

(A:) Whether the student's teacher-

- Has met state qualifications and licensing criteria for the grade levels and subject areas in which the teacher provides instruction.
- Is teaching under emergency or other provisional status through which state qualification or licensing criteria has been waived.
- Is teaching in the field of discipline of the certification of the teacher.

(B:) Whether the child is provided services by paraprofessionals and, if so, their qualifications.

Each parent will be provided information regarding:

- Timely notice that the student has been assigned, or has been taught for four or more consecutive weeks by, a teacher who does not meet applicable State certification or licensure requirements at the grade level and subject area in which the teacher has been assigned.
- Information on the level of achievement and academic growth of the student, if applicable and available, on each of the State academic assessments required under this part.

What We Teach!

The School District of Flagler County uses the Florida State Standards. The B.E.S.T. standards.

The standards reflect what all students should know and be able to do in each grade from Kindergarten through 12th grade.

How We Will Measure Learning and Progress Monitoring This Year!



- Florida Assessment of Student Thinking (F.A.S.T.) Progress Monitoring will be given 3 times a year statewide in grades VPK-10
 - Tentative dates are PM #1: August-September
 - PM #2: December January
 - PM #3: May-June
- Statewide Science Assessment (grades 5 and 8)
- End of Course Assessments (EOCs) (for selected courses in Middle & High Schools)
- ACT/SAT
- ACCESS 2.0 (ESOL students)
